  Margaret's primary care doctor is concerned about the severity of her symptoms and refers her to a Washington University Physician at Barnes-Jewish Hospital for an in-depth assessment.
- Secondary Care Medical specialists

  A cardiologist rules out heart problems but suspects pulmonary disease. Margaret is referred to a tertiary provider this time, a pulmonary specialist for a conclusive assessment.

  Specialized consults, diagnostics, treatments

  This pulmonologist confirms that Margaret is experiencing a significant decrease in pulmonary function. Diagnosis:
- Advanced Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease emphysema.

  Advanced medicine, highly specialized, research-oriented

  Next, a thoracic surgeon considers whether a lung volume reduction surgery would relieve Margaret's symptoms. Instead, given her condition, it is recommended that she consider participating in a clinical research trial for a new treatment modality.
